What a great meeting we had Saturday, April 13th at Sutter's Mill. Many of you came to hear "Women in History" given by Chatsworth High School senior students. These girls are part of a four year Humanitas Program. In their history class they chose a woman to research. There are three classes involved in the program, therefore 120 women were chosen and no duplication occurred. Their English class assignment was a written essay about the woman and a poem was written describing the woman with the final line "Who Am I". In their Art class the assignment was making a vessel of paper mache. Their "vessel of knowledge" included symbols depicting the woman they studied. Kathy Donner, the Art teacher, started the presentation telling us about the Humanitas Program that she has been a part of for twenty years. I was glad Mrs. Donner and the six young women were able to be our guests.

At our last board meeting, we discussed leadership in our branch. We are considering a new form of branch leadership. This leadership would include coordinating committees made up of as many members as possible on a committee to help get more members involved in the working of the branch. The proposed committees would be:

Administration: a contact person, a secretary, and a treasurer and several others; Program and Projects: a committee to organize a service project and a committee to plan 3 or 4 programs;


Membership Activities: a committee to plan socials and one to keep our Interest groups going.


